
Order of service Sunday May 31st ²⁰²⁰ Pentecost A celebration of the Holy Spirit inspiring faithful discipleship.



Today is the day the church celebrates Pentecost!

Let us begin our worship with a prayer for our Aboriginal sisters and brothers.

This Reconciliation Week, we pray for God's justice, healing and truth for our Aboriginal People, the traditional custodians of the land. Please acknowledge the deep feelings of attachment and relationship that Aboriginal people have with country and respect and value their past, present and on going spiritual and cultural connections with the land.

Please pray for truth, Dignity, Treaty and Healing to continue.

Pentacost is a day of celebration.

What are we celebrating during this time of our emergence from the Covid lockdown? You might like to look at the collage from the church community.

Pentacost is the day according to Acts2: when the Holy Spirit descended upon the apostles of Jesus and the women, including Mary mother of Jesus, who were gathered together in an upstairs room in Jerusalem.

The Holy Spirit came upon the men and women and sent them out to tell the good news of God's love for **all** people made known through Jesus Christ! Pentacost is celebrated 50 days after easter: on the day of the Jewish festival called Whitsunday

Whitsunday is a harvest festival observed on the 50th day from Passover.

So from this we can see how Christian observances arose from Jewish (and pagan) celebrations.

The colours of red, orange, yellow – are associated with Pentacost flame, fire and wind.

Pentacost celebrates the birth of the church, as the apostles went out inflamed with the power of the Holy Spirit, to spread the good news of Gods love, compassion and forgiveness for all people, to all nations and in all languages.

What do we know about the Holy Spirit?

It is the Spirit of Jesus – the Spirit of God – It was there is the beginning of creation with God. The Holy Spirit is Gods helper, animator - Our wise counsellor, helper and comforter. The Holy Spirit is God's power - always loving, always gentle, always Kind, always patient, consistent, clear, uplifting.

It takes time to learn to listen to the Holy Spirit – but when we remember these qualities we can distinguish between the Holy Spirit and other voices in our lives.(fear , jealousy, greed , pride)

Jesus often prayed and it is often in silence and prayer (which can be a caring conversation) that we can hear the Holy Spirit more clearly.

What is the Holy Spirit prompting you towards in your life right now?

The Holy Spirit calls us to learn more about "the ways" of Jesus.

One way is through Christian meditation

Another way is through reading our bible!

Ten days after Jesus'ascension, came the Jewish festival called Pentecost. (Acts 1:9,2:1-4) The disciples were all gathered together, with the women and Mary the mother of Jesus. Suddenly there was a noise from the sky. It sounded like a strong wind and it filled the house where they were sitting. Then it seemed as if tongues of flame spread out and touched each person there. Suddenly they knew they could do things they had never been able to do before: they had new strength to tell the whole world about Jesus, for Jesus was with them in this new way for always.

They went out into the streets of Jerusalem with a message for the people; a message about God's love, compassion and forgiveness for all people. Jesus had made this known. Jesus gave us life in the Spirit. With the power of the Holy Spirit they spread the message to the furtherest corners of the world.

Meditation is designed to help us move from the head space (thinking) to the heart space (connecting).
